1 About this career

A Medico-Legal Advisor is the bridge between medicine and law. They give expert opinions to doctors, hospitals, insurers, courts and police in cases that need both medical and legal understanding — medical negligence claims, legal analysis of post-mortem and injury reports, forensic evidence, health law, patients' rights and consumer-court litigation. They read medical records to prepare expert testimony, guide lawyers, and help hospitals stay legally compliant. There are two entry routes — becoming an MBBS/BDS doctor and then studying medical law, or becoming a lawyer (LLB) and specialising in health/forensic law.

3 What you need

INTERESTS

- Deep interest in both medicine and law
- Commitment to justice, patients' rights and ethics
- Enjoy analysing facts, evidence and medical records

ABILITIES

- Logical thinking and meticulous analytical ability
- Objectivity, confidentiality and high ethical standards
- Clear writing and effective communication (written and oral)

4 How to get there

- 1 Complete Class 12 — take Science (PCB) for the doctor route; any stream works for the law route.
- 2 Route A: Do MBBS/BDS, then a medical-law diploma/LLB, or an MD in Forensic Medicine.
- 3 Route B: Do a 3-year LLB or 5-year integrated BA-LLB and specialise in health/medical law.
- 4 Add a PG Diploma in Medical Law & Ethics or an LLM in Health Law (many NLUs admit via CLAT-PG).
- 5 Intern/gain experience in a hospital, insurer, law firm or consumer forum and work on medico-legal cases.
- 6 To practise as an advocate, register with the Bar Council; keep adding medical/forensic credentials for expert opinion work.

FEES

LLM at a government NLU costs roughly ₹1.5–2.5 lakh per year; a PG Diploma in Medical Law costs about ₹40,000–1,00,000. MBBS/MD Forensic Medicine at a government medical college costs very little (a few thousand rupees a year), while private institutes charge many times more.

6 What the work is like

WHERE YOU WORK

Large hospitals and corporate healthcare chains, insurance companies, law firms, consumer and civil courts, state forensic science labs, medical councils, and hospital legal/compliance departments.

WORK CULTURE

It is mainly desk-based advisory work — reading and writing case files, medical records and reports. Court testimony, hospital or site visits and meetings with doctors and lawyers are also part of it. There is deadline pressure and 40+ hours a week is common.

WHO HIRES

- Large hospitals and corporate healthcare groups (medico-legal cells)
- Health and life insurance companies (claims investigation)

- Law firms and independent advocates (medical negligence litigation)
- Medical councils, state health departments and regulatory bodies
- Consumer forums, civil/criminal courts and state forensic labs
- Pharma and medical-device companies and third-party administrators (TPAs)

DEMAND (2026)

Demand for medico-legal experts is rising fast in India due to expanding healthcare, growing medical-negligence litigation, insurance claims and greater awareness of patients' rights. Hospitals now build in-house medico-legal cells to manage legal risk, and insurers and law firms seek people who understand both medicine and law. It is a niche but growing career with a shortage of skilled professionals.

Starting	₹25,000–45,000/माह
Mid level	₹60,000–1,10,000/माह
Senior level	₹1,50,000–3,00,000+/माह

Starting pay depends on the role and qualifications. Per Indeed and salary-data sources, experienced medico-legal advisors earn around ₹60,000–1,00,000/month, and those with dual medical-plus-law credentials or independent expert-witness practice earn considerably more. Government forensic/medical-college posts offer good pay scales and stability.

8 The good parts · The challenges

The good parts

- A rare, respected career combining expertise in both medicine and law
- Rising demand, good income and scope for independent consulting/testimony
- Meaningful role in delivering justice and protecting patients' rights

The challenges

- Long, dual education (medical + legal) and continuous study required
- Stress and high accountability in sensitive, contested cases
- Court processes are slow; outcomes take time

9 Real-life journeys

Tirath Das Dogra

Forensic medicine expert, former Head of Forensic Medicine, AIIMS New Delhi

Dr. Tirath Das Dogra earned the first MD in Forensic Medicine from AIIMS Delhi and headed its Department of Forensic Medicine and Toxicology from 1987 to 2012. He established the DNA facility and the medical-toxicology laboratory at AIIMS and gave expert medico-legal opinions in many of India's most high-profile cases — including the post-mortem in the Indira Gandhi assassination and cases such as Rajiv Gandhi, Aarushi and Bilkis Bano. His life shows how decisive an expert standing at the crossroads of medicine and law can be for the justice system.
